

Year 5 Homework – Autumn Term 2017

Below is your homework grid for this half term. You are expected to complete one of these tasks per week, to the best of your ability. The tasks are all open ended, so you can present them in any way you choose, and you can extend them as much as you wish. If you choose to complete your work on a computer, please print off your work.

We expect you to choose a variety of activities. If you choose a maths based activity one week, make sure you choose from another column the following week. You can only choose each activity once!

You will give your homework books in every Thursday and they will be returned to you on the following day.

You are still expected to read every night, for at least 20 minutes, and practise your spellings and give the sheet in on a Friday.

Marking will be given as house points:

Keep a note of when you started your journey and what time you arrived. Calculate how long the journey lasted. Calculate this in hours and minutes. How many minutes is this? If you had been delayed in a traffic jam for 45 minutes, how long would your journey have been?	Research and cook a Greek dish. Write the ingredients and method. Take a photograph of you sharing the finished dish with your family or friends.
Write a recount of a film or cartoon you have watched. Remember to include time connectives to sequence your ideas.	When you go shopping, estimate how much the total bill will be. How accurate was your estimate? Write the details in your homework book. Find the difference between the estimate and the final bill.	Keep a diary of any 'Random Acts of Kindness' you have performed over the course of one week.
If you could invite any author to visit the school, who would you choose? Write a letter to the author inviting them to our school?	Write 5 addition or subtraction word problems for your friends to solve. Make sure you know the answers!	Research and create a poster about Isaac Newton's life and findings.
Find a poem you enjoy reading or listening to. Practise performing the poem to someone at home.	If I know that 6×8 is 48. What else do I know? Impress me with six facts.	What would you like to do as a job when you grow up? What skills and qualities will you need to do this job? What could you do now to help you towards your goal?

By October half term you are expected to complete three of these pieces, and at least one from each column.

By Christmas it'll be 10 pieces from across all the columns.
